**POINTS OF INTEREST**

- 1. LAST CHANCE GULCH (E-4):** Gold was discovered on July 14, 1862. Third National and present State Capital, State Capitol Building and Historical Museum and Library, visitors welcome. Conducted tour of Helena by Last Chance Tour Train. Carroll College, Veterans Hospital, Mountain View School, State Library, Governor's Old Mansion, Von Tech Center.
- 2. RICHEST HILL ON EARTH (F-4):** Gold, silver, copper, and zinc from deep mines and open pits. World Museum of Mining, a acres of history and relics of yesterday to the present. Montana College of Mineral Science and Technology, Von Tech Center.
- 3. LITTLE BIGHORN BATTLEFIELD NATIONAL MONUMENT (G-12):** Battle of Little Bighorn, U.S. Public George A. Custer and his Seventh Cavalry were slain to the west of the combined Sioux and Cheyenne Indian forces. Montana State University, Museum of the Rockies, Montana Agriculture Experiment Station, Montana Bible College, Idaho Falls, Idaho.
- 4. FORT PECK DAM AND RESERVOIR (C-10):** Boating and fishing. Largest hydroelectric dam in Montana. Reservoir 1.34 miles in length with 1,600 miles of shoreline. Recreation areas. Facilities include: over 400 specimens on display in power plant museum. **CAGES OF THE MOUNTAINS (D-8):** Discovered and named July 19, 1805, by Lewis and Clark. Sheep cliffs rise to 1,200 feet above the canyon. About 100 mountain goats, bighorn sheep, deer, bear, bighorn sheep and mountain goats. Boat launch, picnic grounds, and outdoor recreation.
- 5. GREAT FALLS OF THE MISSOURI RIVER (C-5):** Discovered in 1805 by Lewis and Clark. Beautiful, limestone, 200 foot high waterfall. Great Falls State Park. Five hydroelectric power plants. **CROW COUNTRY (G-7):** Covered by a magnificent panorama of the alpine lakes and trout here. Early mining camps, historic buildings, and scenic views.
- 6. LEWIS AND CLARK CAVES (F-8):** Montana's first and best show park. Features one of the most beautiful limestone cave caverns in the Northwest. Colorful stalactites, stalagmites, and other formations. **NATIONAL BISON RANGE (D-2):** Large herd of bison, also elk, pronghorn, whitetail and mule deer, and many other species and waterfowl. Self-guided tour from June until Labor Day. Visitors Center.
- 7. YELLOWTAIL DAM AND HIGHCHURN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA (G-9):** Multi-million dollar 500 foot hydroelectric dam in spectacular Canyon. Visitors Center, boating, fishing and recreation. **MUSEUM OF THE PLAINS INDIAN (B-3):** An exhibition and crafts center depicting the life of the Northern Plains Indians under supervision of the Indian Arts and Crafts Board.
- 8. COW CAPITAL OF THE WEST (F-11):** Historic Old West Museum, a memorial to those who rode the untamed range. Annual rodeo. **COW CAPITAL OF THE WEST (F-11):** Historic Old West Museum, a memorial to those who rode the untamed range. Annual rodeo. **ST. IGNATIUS MISSION (D-2):** Established in 1854 for the Northern Plains. The present church is said to be the third most beautiful in the world. A visit is a very rewarding experience. **MEDICINE ROCKS (F-12):** 220 acres containing numerous unique and odd-shaped sandstone formations, a result of wind erosion. **PANTLER BEAR ROUTE AT (F-8):** Anzac exhibit area, Lake, Philbrick, Drummond, fishing, hunting, camping, boating, and more. **HUNGRY HORSE DAM (B-2):** A 564 ft. high dam forms a reservoir and provides hydroelectric power. Also antelope, deer and occasionally even elk.
