## POINTS OF INTEREST

- LAST CHANCE GULCH (E-4)**: Gold was discovered on July 24, 1864. Third Terminal and present State Capitol Building and Historical Museum and Library, visitors welcome. Conducted tour of Helena by Last Chance tour train, Carroll College, Veterans History Center, Montana State University, Governor's Old Mansion, Helena Caves, Oscar's Creamery, Zooklandia, Bear Park, Pioneer's Plaza.
- BUTTE (F-4)**: History tour of the historic area, World Museum of Mining, and 1970s National Camp, Berkeley Art Museum, Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, St. Mary's, St. Charles Dealing, St. Ignace, St. Ann's, St. Vincent, St. Joseph, St. Ann's, Memorial, Butte City Hall.
- BATTLEFIELD NATIONAL MONUMENT (G-9)**: June 25, 1876, Battle of the Little Bighorn. U.S. Col. George Armstrong Custer and his 7th Cavalry were defeated by the combined Sioux and Cheyenne Indian forces.
- PECK DAM AND RESERVOIR (C-4)**: Features Montana's largest hydroelectric dam impounds the Missouri River forming a reservoir 134 miles in length with over 1,600 miles of shoreline. Recreation area. Fossiliferous rocks over 400 specimens on display in power plant museum.
- GATES OF THE MOUNTAINS (D-4)**: Discovered and named by Lewis and Clark in 1805. Features spectacular views over the Missouri River and surrounding mountains. Boat tours, fishing, and outdoor recreation.
- GREAT FALLS OF THE MISSOURI RIVER (C-5)**: Discovered by Lewis and Clark in 1805. Features spectacular views over the Missouri River and surrounding mountains. Boat tours, fishing, and outdoor recreation.
- LEWIS AND CLARK (F-5)**: Montana's first and best preserved site of the Lewis and Clark expedition. Features the original site of the expedition's winter camp, the Lewis and Clark National Historic Site, and the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail.
- MUSEUM OF THE PLAINS INDIAN (B-3)**: An exhibition and crafts center portraying the life of the Northern Plains Indians. Features the Buffalo Bill Center of the West, the Northern Plains Indian Museum, and the Northern Plains Indian Center.
- ST. IGNACE (G-4)**: Home of the first Catholic mission in Montana. Features the St. Ignace Mission, the St. Ignace Cemetery, and the St. Ignace Chapel.
- MEDICINE ROCK (F-12)**: 200-year-old volcanic rock formation, a result of wind erosion. Features the Medicine Rock National Monument, the Medicine Rock State Park, and the Medicine Rock State Historic Site.
- FRANKLIN DAM (F-3)**: A multi-million dollar multi-purpose water resources project. Features the Franklin Dam, the Franklin Dam Reservoir, and the Franklin Dam State Park.
- ST. LABRE INDIAN MISSION (G-10)**: A historic site featuring the St. Labre Indian Mission, the St. Labre Indian Cemetery, and the St. Labre Indian Chapel.
- SCOREY (A-11)**: Daniels County Museum consists of restored county courthouse, Sheriff's Office, and other historic buildings. Features the Scorey County Museum, the Scorey County Courthouse, and the Scorey County Sheriff's Office.
- HUNGRY HORSE DAM (B-2)**: A 564 ft. high dam forms a reservoir surrounded by beautiful scenery. Features the Hungry Horse Dam, the Hungry Horse Reservoir, and the Hungry Horse State Park.
- OLD TRAIL MUSEUM (C-4)**: Chronological history of the Rocky Mountain Front. Features the Old Trail Museum, the Old Trail State Park, and the Old Trail State Historic Site.
