Bridge Deck Placed on Billings Bypass Yellowstone River Bridge; Webcam Offers the Public Live View

Construction continues on the Billings Bypass Yellowstone River Bridge and the adjacent roadway that will connect the bridge to Five Mile Road. Rebar is being placed on the newly constructed bridge structure. Sequenced concrete pours over the next of couple months will complete the bridge deck surface and separated multi-use path. The 1,858-foot bridge, paired with other segments of the Billings Bypass project, will ultimately provide motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians a connection between Lockwood and the Billings Heights. A temporary bridge on the south-western side of the bridge provides a place for cranes to lift materials into place.

Wadsworth Brothers Construction is building the bridge and are planning to be predominantly complete by the end of 2021.

Work zone safety reminder: The Yellowstone River Bridge construction zone is closed to the public for public safety. Members of the public interested in viewing progress may watch the construction webcam available on the project website (<https://www.mdt.mt.gov/pubinvolve/billingsbypass/>) or from areas within Dover Park accessible to the public. Please be aware of and comply with trail closure signs for your own safety.
