KEY ACTION ITEMS

- MDT will be repaying Main Street in 2020 (but not the intersection). Can anything be improved as part of that project? MDT
- Meet with property owners who are most directly impacted and could not attend meeting (Asks & Boothill Inn). MDT & Kittelson
- Evaluate cost/benefit of signalizing Aronson Avenue. Kittelson

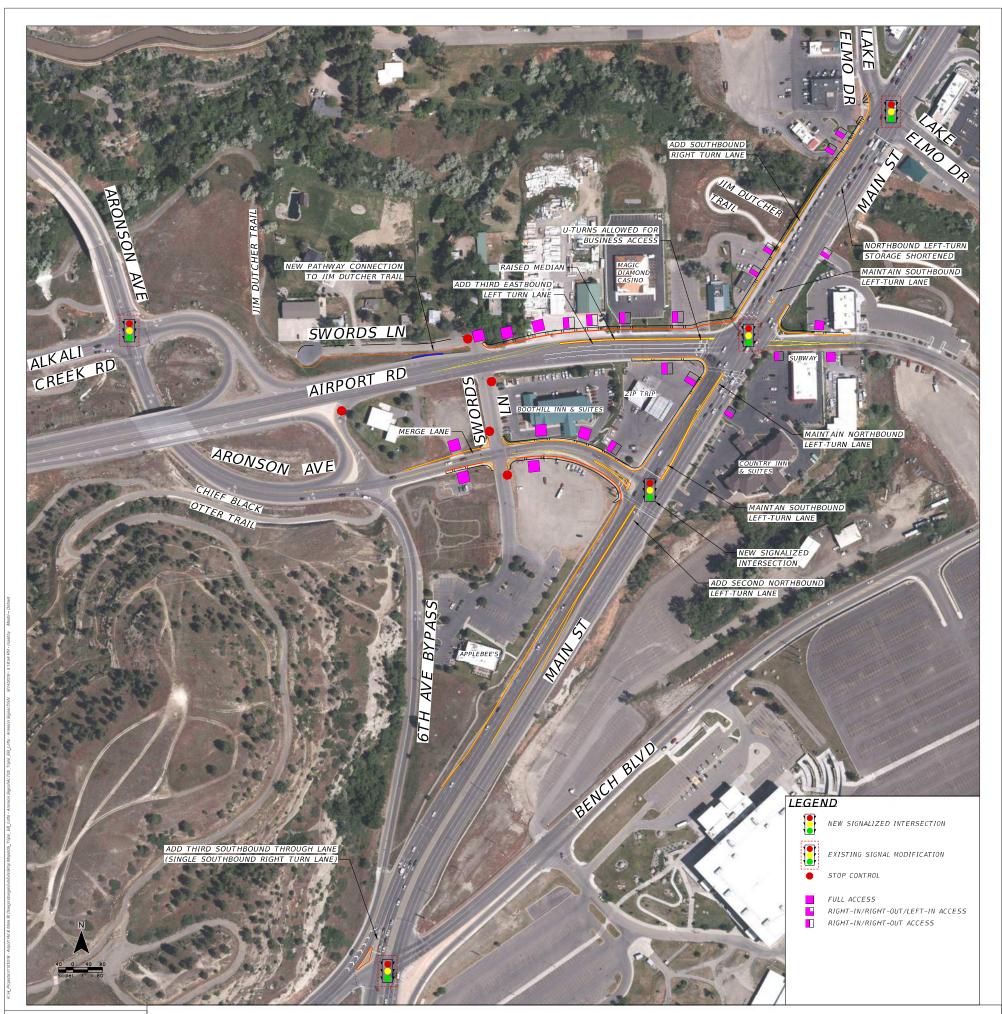
CONCEPT UPDATES – THE COMBINED CONCEPT

In summary the combined concept:

- Balances regional mobility with local access
- Improves operations (to a lesser extent than original preferred alternative) and safety
- Adds triple eastbound lefts from Airport Road East to Main Street
- Maintains southbound right turn from Main Street to Airport Road
- Provides an option to signalize Aronson Avenue or leave it unsignalized with minimal improvements
 to accommodate commuter traffic but discourage truck traffic (additional work as to be done to
 weigh the costs/benefits of signalizing Aronson Avenue)
- Has two westbound lanes on Airport Road East to help address MetraPark traffic
- Improves connectivity and crossings for pedestrians and bicyclists

Discussion

- There was some support expressed for the Combined Concept.
 - It is an incremental improvement that helps to address the current and future traffic congestion and safety conditions.
 - o It is the least impactful to adjacent property owners.
 - o It is the least expensive alternative.
- Some expressed concerns that the project was unnecessary. Key reasons stated:
 - Other regional projects should be completed first to see if they reduce traffic along this corridor.
 - o It is an unnecessary expenditure of taxpayer money.
 - Signal timing and signal reconfiguration (green arrows, yellow flashing arrows, free rights on red) could address the delays, especially for trucks making a left turn on Airport Road East (today only one semi can get through signal and often block the intersection).
 - o Long range planning should take place to identify new corridors, interchanges, etc.
- All agreed two lanes, west bound on Airport Road East were needed to address MetraPark traffic.
