Frequently Asked Questions

1. 1. What is the purpose of the project?

The project will rehabilitate and extend the service life of several roads in the Butte area. The project will provide critical repairs and a smoother driving surface for motorists. Additionally, the work completed will preserve the pavement, increasing the longevity of these roadways.



2. Where is the project?

The project takes place at seven locations in Butte, including:

- Excelsior Avenue between Platinum Street and Caledonia Street.
- Park Street between Montana Street and Mining Museum Road.
- Grand Avenue between Harrison Avenue and Continental Drive.
- Amherst Avenue between Harrison Avenue and Continental Drive.
- Elizabeth Warren between Harrison Avenue and Continental Drive.
- Four Mile Road between Harrison Avenue and Utah Avenue; Utah Avenue between Four Mile Road and Electric Street; Electric Street between Utah Avenue and Western Boulevard; and Western Boulevard between Electric Street and Holmes Avenue.
- Shields Avenue and Farrell Street, beginning just north of the railroad bridge on Shields
 Avenue and continuing to just past the Montana Resources railroad crossing near Stuart
 Avenue.

3. Why is this project necessary?

These roads are aging and need repairs. Cracks in the roadway can expand if not addressed and create more expensive repairs if left unchecked. Additionally, the pavement markings are fading from these roadways, making it less clear to motorists where lanes begin and end. This project will address these needed repairs and enhance the driving experience for motorists using these routes.

4. What should motorists expect during construction?

Due to the nature of this project, traffic controls will vary on a case-by-case basis.

Anticipated traffic control:

- Flaggers or traffic sensing smart signals may direct traffic.
- Reduced speed limits.
- Expect delays.
- On-street parking may be briefly disrupted during road work.
- Wide loads may be restricted on a case-by-case basis for the roadways. Visit 511mt.net for the most up-to-date information.
