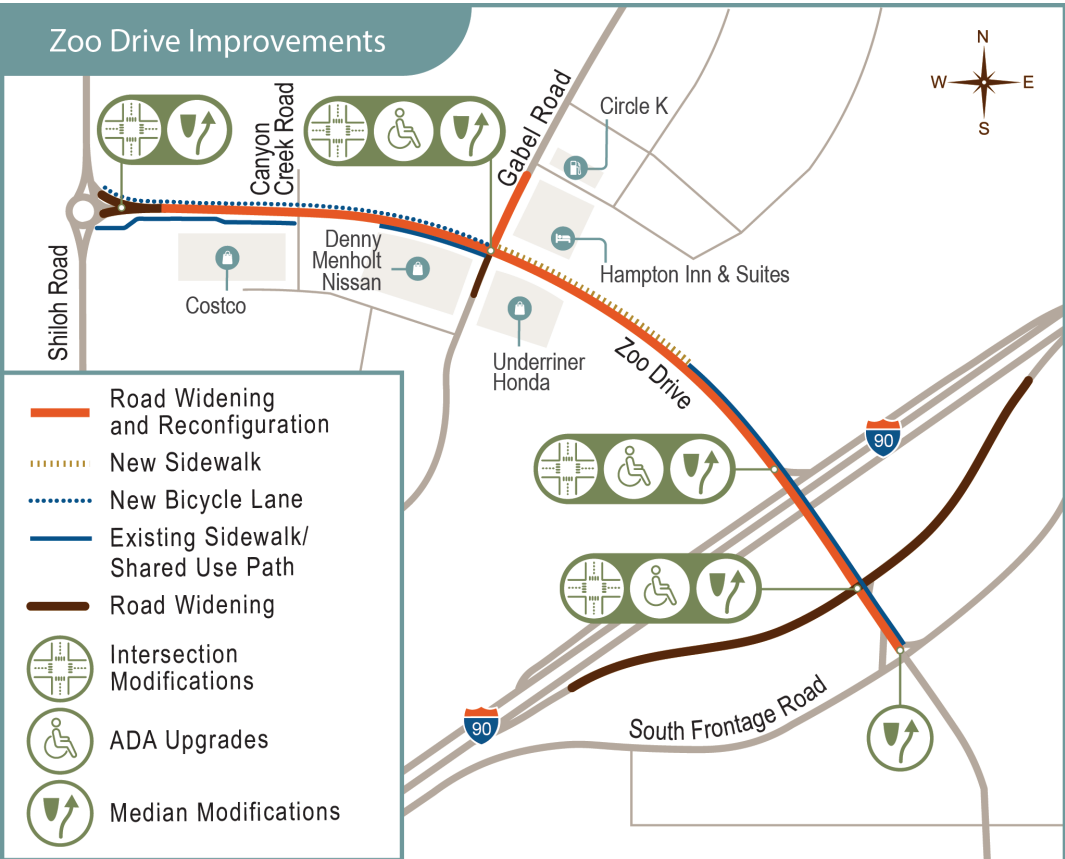
ZOO DRIVE IMPROVEMENTS

Project Overview

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) and its partner Knife River plan to improve traffic operations and enhance roadway safety features on Zoo Drive, between Shiloh Road and South Frontage Road, through the *Zoo Drive Improvements* project. Construction will begin this summer with anticipated completion in the fall of 2025.

Planned Improvements Include:

- Widening and reconfiguring Zoo Drive to a five-lane roadway with two lanes in each direction and a center turn lane.
- Widening and reconfiguring a section of Gabel Road between Circle K and the intersection with Zoo Drive to a five-lane layout with four southbound lanes. This will include a second left turn lane from Gabel Road onto Zoo Drive, toward Interstate 90 (I-90).
- Intersection and traffic signal improvements.
- Pavement marking modifications.
- Median modifications.
- Additional connectivity for pedestrians and bicyclists.
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) upgrades.
- Widening the eastbound I-90 ramps.
- Milling and paving the roadway.
