The Aviation Career Exploration (ACE) Academy offers high school students a glimpse into the diverse career paths available in the aviation sector. On the first day, the experience will kick off with flights aboard general aviation aircraft! Participants will tour Pioneer Aerostructure's manufacturing facility, the Army National Guard Aviation Support Facility, Helena College's aviation maintenance technician program, maintenance facilities, and Montana Medical Transport (an air ambulance operation).

On the second day, students will be in Missoula for visits to Northstar/Neptune Aviation, the Museum of Mountain Flying, the Smokejumper Base, and the Missoula air traffic control (ATC) tower.

The third and final day will conclude with a general aviation fly-in at the Canyon Ferry airstrip. If you know any high school students who are interested in exploring the exciting world of aviation and the various opportunities it presents, please pass this information along to them!

On May 24, 2007, the U.S. House of Representatives introduced a resolution to create a National Aviation Maintenance Technician Day. Currently 45 states observe National Aviation Maintenance Technician Day on Taylors' birthday, May 24th.

FAA Proposes Elimination of RCO System

The FAA plans to decommission the remote communications outlet (RCO) system due to a significant decline in usage, with daily requests dropping from 22,000 in the mid-1980s to fewer than 300 today. While mobile technology has largely replaced the need for RCOs, the AOPA warns that many pilots and aircraft still rely on this network for safety, especially in areas with limited radio coverage. The FAA's plan to close the remaining 936 RCOs in the U.S. could save about \$16 million annually. AOPA suggests a phased reduction instead, as not all segments of the aviation community are ready for this change. Written comments on the plan are due by May 27 and MDT Aeronautics will be submitting their feedback.

Yellowstone Airport Opens for Season

The Yellowstone Airport and Fixed Based Operator (FBO) are now open for the season. The newly constructed airline passenger terminal will accommodate inaugural airline passenger flights beginning May 6. The new terminal building replaced the original terminal constructed in the early 1960's, which was beyond the end of its useful life.

Dell Airport Update

It has been a year since the State sold the Dell Airport to a private land owner. Since then, the runway has been repaved by its new owner! Per the terms of the sale, the airport must remain open to the public and no fees may be charged to aircraft weighing less than 12,500 pounds.

New BasicMed Allowances

You can now act as pilot in command of an aircraft, while operating under BasicMed, weighing up to 6,000 pounds maximum gross takeoff weight. Additionally, the maximum allowable passengers increased from 5 to 6 in an aircraft certified for up to 7 occupants.



Use the Weather Cameras!

The summer flying season is here, which means thunderstorms are here too. Montana is one of few states leading the charge to install FAA approved weather cameras around the state. These cameras aid in preflight planning and enroute decision making. It can be very helpful to get a real-time view of the actual conditions along your route of flight.

Density Altitude Reminder

In 2022, the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA) launched a campaign to raise awareness of density altitude (DA), introducing a new reminder poster at various airports, including those in Montana. Look for these posters at self-serve fuel pumps, pilot lounges, and other locations.

The Montana Pilots Association (MPA), along with the MDT Aeronautics Division and volunteers, collaborated to calculate and install these posters at key points for pilots. The MPA calculated DA for public airports, while the MDT Aeronautics Division assisted in production and placement.

High, hot, and humid conditions significantly decrease aircraft performance and can lead to accidents, especially in Montana, where DA is often a factor in incidents. Even when departing from a 7,000-foot runway, performance may be inadequate in high DA conditions.

High DA affects true airspeed, takeoff, and landing rolls, while reducing climb rates. Remember that performance data in Pilots Operating Handbooks (POH) is based at sea level. Always review your aircraft's performance charts before flying, considering current conditions. Keeping a Koch Chart in the cockpit can provide a quick reference and

help you assess the impact of DA on your flight.

Be on the lookout for these DA posters at Montana's airports and give them a look before you fly. You might be surprised!


