Airport Operations and Infrastructure

MDT Aeronautics continues to maintain 14 state-owned airports that support access, training, safety, recreation, emergency services, community connectivity, and more throughout Montana. Recent newsletter coverage highlighted infrastructure improvements at state-owned airports, including Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)-supported projects that improve facilities, equipment storage, and operational readiness.

Summer is also a key season for airport maintenance, construction activity, inspections, and local improvement work statewide. Pilots should expect changing conditions at some airports and should make a habit of checking current airport information, published advisories, and local conditions before departure.

MDT Aeronautics is contracted with the FAA to inspect all non-primary public airports in Montana. We inspect things such as obstructions on approaches, lighting, pavement conditions, runway markings, windsocks, etc. All the information found in the Chart Supplement is derived from MDT Aeronautics airport inspectors.

Airport Sponsors: Aeronautics Loan & Grant Applications Open

As a reminder to airport loan and grant applicants, the loan and grant online portal will accept FY 2028 applications starting July 1 through November 15. If you cannot enter the application, you may have a previous award that needs a closeout form or an annual status report filed.

Projects must be broken down by type and itemized on the application. For example, asphalt projects should be broken down by runway, apron, and taxiway, not as one project lumped together.

Summer Flying in Full Swing Across Montana

Summer is one of the busiest and most rewarding times of year for aviation in Montana. From backcountry strips and community fly-ins to flight training, youth aviation programs, airport improvement work, and recreational flying, July brings long days and high activity across the state. With that activity comes a renewed need for sound planning, disciplined decision-making, and a continued focus on safety for pilots, passengers, airport operators, instructors, and volunteers.

Montana's aviation system supports transportation, emergency response, rural access, economic activity, tourism, recreation, exploration, education, and so much more across a wide geographic area. MDT Aeronautics encourages all aviators to take the extra time this summer to review weather, performance, density altitude, Notices to Airman (NOTAMs), runway conditions, and airport information before each flight.

Weather, Density Altitude, and Backcountry Awareness

July flying in Montana requires careful attention to density altitude, mountain weather, convective activity, smoke, temporary flight restrictions (TFR's) due to fires, changing wind patterns, and rapidly shifting conditions in remote areas. Warm temperatures, shorter takeoff margins, and high-elevation airports can significantly affect aircraft performance and safety margins.

Backcountry and recreational pilots should pay particular attention to runway condition, slope, obstacles, wildlife, soft surfaces, and escape options before landing at unfamiliar strips. A conservative go/no-go mindset and a willingness to delay, divert, or turn around remain essential tools for safe summer flying.

Remember to look for the density altitude awareness posters crafted and distributed by the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, MDT Aeronautics, and the Montana Pilots Association at each public airport across Montana.

Aircraft Registration Reminders

Montana aircraft and pilot registration support many programs and services provided through MDT Aeronautics including educational outreach, safety clinics, trainings, youth aviation education, search and rescue, and aviation publications.

Selling your airplane this year? If you do, please retain a copy of the FAA Bill of Sale and provide a copy to our office to cancel your Montana aircraft registration.

As a reminder, annual renewals are due prior to March 1 and invoices will be mailed in December. Please be sure to update your address with our office if there are any changes.

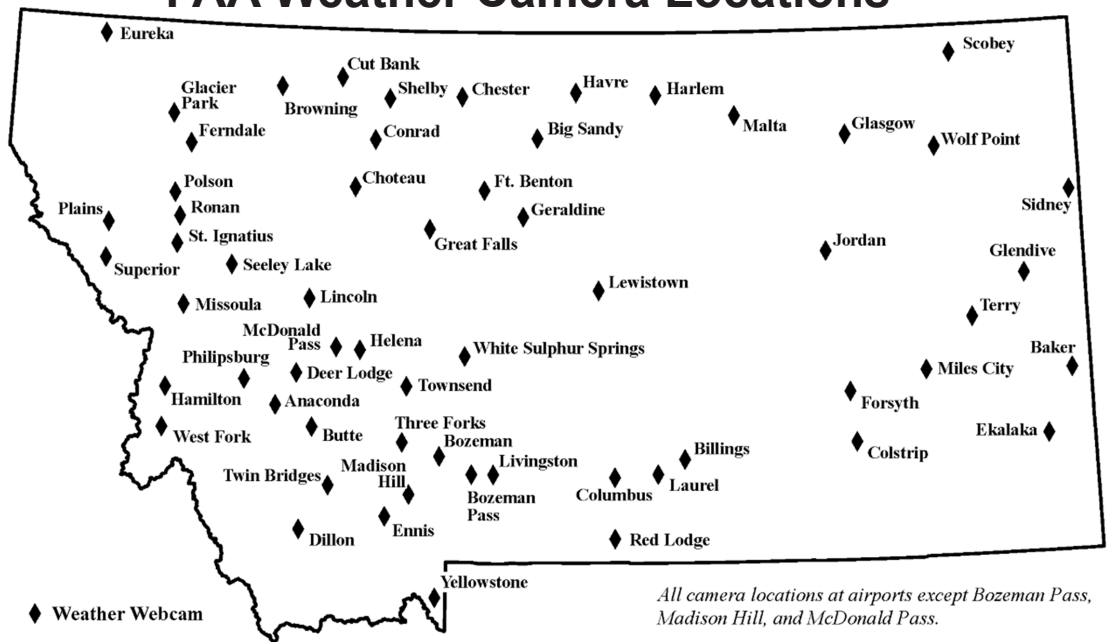
