
Project Updates – Prevention & Education

<u>DUI Project's Addiction Roulette</u>: Steve Schmidt and Leah Joki provided an update/synopsis on the DUI Project's Addiction Roulette. The project was a collaborative effort led by Leah Joki. Leah worked with Missoula Prerelease Center individuals and others in developing a play write focused on challenges of addiction. Survey of attendees reflected a rating from 8-10 (with the scale being 1-10 and 10 being the highest) on their viewing of the DUI-Project Addiction Roulette. The survey also posed the question of "Do you feel the performances of this nature will have a positive impact of public safety (i.e. reducing DUIs, Addressing challenges of substance abuse) in our community? The response was unanimously "Yes". A video may be forthcoming.

Funding for the project was provided by MDT and U of M Arts program. It was a very successful project.

<u>Steer- Court Judge Mary Jane Knisely:</u> Judge Knisely was able to join briefly and did mention that the STEER Court will be hosting and Foundational Training in August for various DUI Court Teams, include Gallatin County and Fort Peck. This is a collaborative effort with the National Center for DWI Courts.




1. Impaired Driving (bac > 0.08 g/100ml) Crashes

 Demographics at County level (Population age 10-40)





Opportunity- Prevention & Education

<u>Alternative Transportation</u>: Montana Government Affair's Director John Iverson discussed the need for collaborative efforts in enhancing and supporting transportation alternatives. To prevent impaired driving before they happen. John mentioned Tri-County Uber program and reinforced the need for support from a variety of stakeholders for alternative transportation. (*To be noted- the proper term to be used is alternative transportation. There is currently a TA program which may lead to confusion between the two initiatives.*)
